12-121 14. Communication from the Retirement Board:

I am in receipt of Council Order No. 12-121 relative to compensation for employees of the City of Revere who are called up to active military duty. Upon reviewing the Ordinance, it has come to my attention that the second sentence in paragraph D, which provides “An Employee may pay into the Retirement System up to 100% of their City base salary” is inconsistent with Chapter 32 of the General Laws governing State and Municipal Retirement, and may therefore not be implemented or enforced.

C. 32, s. 22(1)(b) mandates the specific contribution rates which must be withheld from an employee’s regular compensation based on the date the employee establishes membership in the Retirement System. In addition to the limitations contained in State statutes as described above, Internal Revenue Code restricts annual contributions to any defined benefit plan to the lower of 100% of compensation, or \$40,000. Therefore, no employee may contribute in excess of \$40,000 to the Retirement System for any year.

Most importantly, C. 32, 4(1)(h) awards active employees who are members of the Retirement System who go on leave to serve as active duty military personnel creditable service *without requiring that retirement contributions be withheld from their regular compensation while they are on leave*. This section reads as follows:

The period or periods during which any member who is a veteran as defined in section one was on leave of absence from the governmental unit to which the system of which he is a member pertains, for the purpose of service in such campaign and until he was discharged or released from such service in the armed forces, shall be allowed as creditable service.

This was intended to ensure that such military personnel are not penalized for retirement benefits for their service in the military, particularly in municipalities which offer such employees no compensation while they are on leave.

Therefore, in order to ensure that those who serve in our military receive all of the benefits to which they are entitled, I would recommend that the second sentence be deleted from paragraph D, and that it be replaced with a sentence which states, in effect, that an employee who is a member of the City of Revere Retirement System who is on leave to serve as an active duty member

of the United States military shall be awarded creditable service for the period of leave toward his or her retirement in accordance with C. 32, s.4(1)(h).
