**14-187 8. Comm. from the Mayor:**

**Since taking office in January of 2012, it has become apparent to members of the Administration including myself, that we are in desperate need of a large scale study on our capital assets. We currently have no fixed plan to address the replacement of vehicles, upkeep of buildings, or the ongoing management of the capital assets we have. Our current strategy for replacing assets on an emergency basis is simply not sustainable nor prudent.**

**Through our performance management program, known as RevStat, it has become very apparent that a Capitol Needs Assessment, which will act as a bridge towards the creation of a Capital Improvement Plan, we will be beneficial to the City as a whole. The Capital Improvement Plan will go beyond simply addressing which streets will be repaired throughout the city. It will address all of our fixed assets and create a five year plan outlining specific improvements.**

**I am requesting that your honorable body approve an appropriation from the Stabilization fund in the amount of \$45,000 dollars to conduct a study run through the Edward J. Collins Center for Public Management the University of Massachusetts since UMass is a public institution the request is a bid exempt.**

I understand that this matter will go to the Ways and Means Subcommittee. Representatives from the Collins Center will be available to discuss the proposal at a time and date specified by the City Council.
