13-073                    8.     Comm. from the Mayor:

Re: NECCO Solar Project Agreement

I am writing to ask the Revere City Council to ratify the agreement between the City of Revere and Sage Stone LLC to develop and operate a solar photovoltaic generation facility on the NECCO property located at 135 American Legion Highway and potentially one or more other privately-owned sites.

Sage Stone LLC is an international renewable energy development and investment company. They have extensive experience in energy project development and strategic partnering. Sage Stone is developing utility scale solar and wind projects in partnership with municipalities across Massachusetts including the City of Revere.

Sage Stone designs, permits, finances, constructs, owns and operates the solar project behind new National Grid meters and delivers solar electricity directly to the National Grid distribution system. The City will serve as a “Host Consumer” of the solar facility and the National Grid account holder for electric meters in which the solar project resides. Solar electricity is delivered to National Grid in exchange for net metering credits, consistent with the MA Green Communities Act. Net metering credits are dollars denominated and used to offset National Grid charges on the Cities utility bills like a certificate which can be used to reduce the communities National Grid Bills. *NOTE: The solar projects are not on City-owned property and, the City is not being asked to invest in or contribute funds toward the development of the solar project(s).*

The electricity paid by Revere to Sage Stone is calculated so that the City retains 12% of the value of the credits for the first five years and 20% thereafter. The City receives a new 25+ year revenue stream projected at \$8,400,000 for enabling a renewable energy project but incurs none of the risks associated with developing, owning or operating such a project.

I hope this honorable body will review the attached contract and ratify the agreement.

**Re: MWRA Pipeline Assistance Program**

**I am submitting the following language for a public hearing request for the authorization of a bond order for the replacement of various water mains, valves, and hydrants under the MWRA Pipeline Assistance Program. Under the Phase 1 MWRA water financial assistance program, these funds are available to the City of Revere for water main improvements in the form of a 10-year interest free loan. The loan order is for \$2.5 million and will provide for the replacement of existing deficient water mains on Beach Street (Mahoney Circle to Shirley Ave. under bridge), Camille Road and Joey Road for the replacement of existing asbestos water pipe, Crest Avenue, Centennial**

Avenue, Florence Avenue, Walnut Avenue (James Ave. to Woods Ave.), Naples Road, and North Shore Road (Revere St. to Shawmut St.). In addition to the replacement of these antiquated and deficient water mains, funds from this program will be used to install a variable speed pump at the reservoir to further improve stabilization of pressure within the City's water system.

**ORDERED:** That \$2,500,000 (two million five hundred thousand dollars and no cents) be appropriated for design and construction of water system improvements including the payment of all costs incidental or related thereto, and to meet this appropriation, the Treasurer, with the approval of the Mayor, be authorized to borrow \$2,500,000 under M.G.L. c. 44, Sec. 8, or any other enabling authority, or from the Massachusetts Water Resource Authority (MWRA) – Local Pipeline Assistance Program (LPAP) and in conjunction therewith, to enter into a loan agreement and/or security agreement with the MWRA relative to such loan, and the Mayor is authorized to contract for and expend and Federal, State or other aid available for the project, including any grant related to such project from the MWRA, and to take any other action necessary or convenient to carry out the projects.

**FURTHER ORDERED:** That the Treasurer is authorized to file an application with the appropriate officials of The Commonwealth of Massachusetts (the "Commonwealth") to qualify under Chapter 44A of the General Laws any and all bonds of the City authorized by this Order, and to provide such information and execute such documents as such officials of the Commonwealth may require in connection therewith.

Thank you for your attention to this important water main replacement program and as usual, I along with Finance Director George Anzuoni, City Planner Frank Stringi, and DPW Superintendent Don Goodwin will be available to further discuss this bond order at the next City Council meeting.

**This letter is to seek the interest of the city of Revere in entering into a like kind exchange on Lots 229 and 232 owned by Rowe Contracting consisting of 2783 sq. ft. each and totaling 5,566 sq. ft. in exchange for lot 17 on Grandview Avenue owned by the city of Revere and consisting 5250 sq. ft. I also am submitting a letter from the Conservation Committee supporting the exchange, which was voted on April 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting along with a letter from Rowe contracting giving me permission to represent them on this matter.**
